Dear Friends,

As you will know by now this is my last Messenger to you and will be circulated on my last Sunday with you, which is Easter Sunday. If one has to have a last Sunday, then I suppose Easter is a wonderful time to choose. It is a season we associate with new life, and eternal hope. It is literally the crux of our faith and belief, and the reason we gather together.

For me, the season is now especially resonant. I now move forward into a new chapter of life which I am looking forward to, and I have just become a grandfather for the first time – baby Erin Olivia was born on March 25th to our middle son Simon and his wife Mairead. So new life indeed on many counts.

St John's also moves into a new phase of its life serving the parish of Greenhill. My reflections on that are quite optimistic. We have tried many things over the past 11 years, and it would be untrue to say they have all worked out. But here we are 11 years on, still with healthy finances, new audio-visual systems, an excellent heating system, and a good Sunday congregation.

My thoughts and memories on St John's? Well, on the one hand, as a centre for promoting the love of Christ, it could not be better situated. On the other hand, that always means dealing with people experiencing stress, difficulty and even despair: that is the nature of a town centre. But that is the message of Christ - new life and new hope are most needed by those whose life is in turmoil and those without hope. So I hope that we will continue to offer that - by excellent music concerts, by extending a welcome to those who want to make community here such as Community Connex, by offering the sacrament, by welcoming families into Messy Church, and by collaborating with other churches in central Harrow in ventures such as the Welcome Centre.

We have an excellent opportunity to reach families even more through collaboration with the local school, St Jerome's. By the time you read this I expect to have welcomed in the whole school once again for an Easter celebration. With the whole school, teachers and parents, I expect to see between 400 and 500 people here on March 27th. My hope is that you develop, extend and deepen that relationship such that it starts to define and characterize the church going forward. I know that soon after my departure the school is leading us in worship on Sunday 12th May.

More "newness" is happening at the back of the church. At long last you can see the commencement of work on our church annex, the future home of our new toilet block, kitchenette and pastoral space. Because we are enhancing our electrical supply as well this also means we can improve and finish our kitchen space in the vestry. Taken together, and with our much more effective heating system, this is the final fruit of our building development programme and leaves St John's in a far stronger position of offering hospitality to people coming in.

The final "newness" will of course be a new vicar. Whoever he or she may be, they will inherit a parish of great potential, with new partnerships all around – school, hall, charities, council and people. St John the Baptist, Greenhill can make a truly wonderful difference to this corner of Harrow. Your wardens will keep you updated on that process, and all I can say is be patient, and give the matter your prayers and support.

So, I'm happy to wish St John the Baptist, Greenhill a very happy new season. I would like to thank in writing all my wardens from the past 11 years, remembering the late Graham Cunnew with special affection, my two treasurers Clare Cook and Simon Patrick, my invincible Secretary Peter Hawkins, and my Administrator, Tina Last, for her energy, enthusiasm and priceless contribution to my work here. And of course, to all of you, the family of St John's. You are the ultimate "without whom" department, and I trust you will continue to support your new vicar when they arrive.
